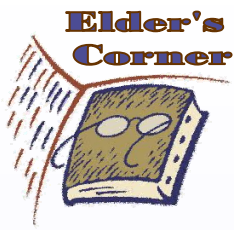

# SAY WHAT?

How many of you can remember the days when all celebrities and the role models of the world smoked cigarettes. Every publicity shot, movie, or interview would find our beloved role models with a cigarette.

Or remember all the family meals that you had growing up with all this wonderful, delicious fried food or high-in-fat desserts. If it wasn't deep fried, it wasn't food. Fast forward to the time when you first heard that smoking caused cancer or that certain foods led to heart disease.

It seems like someone is always trying to tell us that the things we like to eat or do are bad for us. We don't like those messengers or their message. If someone will say something contrary to their gloom and doom message we will quickly grab that message, hold it up and say here is what I believe. Not because it is true, mind you, but because it gives us the excuse we need to keep on going with what we like regardless of the true consequences our actions may bring. We despise the truth if it makes us uncomfortable or sheds a bad light on the things we hold dear or enjoy. We often find the same thing in Scripture.

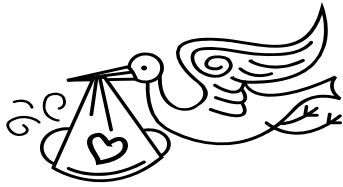
In Jeremiah Ch. 23, Jeremiah is battling the false prophets in Judah who are proclaiming a message different than the true message of God. God is about to bring judgment and wrath for the evil the people are committing in His sight. He is sending Jeremiah to proclaim a message of judgment with a promise of restoration if only they will see their sin and repent. The false prophets are proclaiming a much different message. Paraphrased in today's language would sound like this: "Live and let live. God doesn't want us to be unhappy. Do what ever makes you feel good. Don't worry, be happy." One is speaking the truth and one is telling lies. Who will most people listen to? They will, because of their sinful nature, choose the path of least resistance...they will choose to listen to the lies. Are we not like those people even today? We want to hear how good we are, we want to hear how we deserve everything our heart desires, we want to have it all. Today, some of the most popular preachers are those who distort God's Word. They preach a message that is more in line with the desires of our flesh than in line with a life lived by the Spirit. They shout with enthusiasm "have it all, have it now because God loves you. " Oh how this message tickles our ears. How it goes to the core of our selfish, sinful nature. We want what we want whenever we want it. Tell me what I want to hear, not what I need to hear. 2 Timothy 4:3-4 warns us that in the final days "For the time will come when men will not put up with sound doctrine. Instead, to suit their own desires, they will gather around them a great number of teachers to say what their ears want to hear. They will turn their ears away from the truth and turn aside to myths." We only want the truth if it agrees with our own selfish desires even though our very desires lead to death.

We see Jesus, in Luke 12:49-53, speaking the truth. This message, however, is contrary to the peaceful, loving Jesus we always think about. He tells us in that passage that he has not come to bring peace but to bring division. This is a shock to all who hear, even us today. Didn't the angels proclaim peace on earth at the birth of our Savior? Yet here he is telling us he has come to bring division, which will turn family members against one another. This certainly doesn't sound like the Jesus in the song "Jesus loves me".

Where is the politically correct Savior? The one with the olive branch not the two-edged-sword of truth. Well brothers and sisters in Christ, Jesus does love us and because he loves us he tells us what we need to hear not what we may want to hear.

Jesus is pointing towards the Cross in his words in our passage from Luke. "But I have a baptism to undergo, and how distressed I am until it is completed." The baptism Jesus is going to undergo he does not deserve. The punishment he will receive is not a consequence of his actions for he perfectly fulfilled the laws of God. He lived the perfect life of love and service to the Father which is required of all men but of which none of us can fulfill because of our inherited depravity from our parents Adam and Eve. The punishment belongs to us. The sin he will bear is yours and it is mine. Not a very pleasant truth to hear is it? The sin our flesh clings to leads to something but it is not peace, joy, love but death. Romans reminds us that the wages of sin are death. There is the truth in black and white. Can't sugar coat it. Our sin leads to our death. But this seemingly callous Jesus, in the Luke passage, is actually loving us more than we can ever know or fathom. He willingly stepped down from heaven and took on human flesh. He lived the God pleasing life we could not. He then suffered and died the death we deserved and in Holy Baptism removes our filthy, sin stained rags and clothes us in his righteousness. You see he did not come to bring peace, as we want to understand it. A peace we define as doing whatever we want without consequences but rather he brings us a peace we need...peace with God. Now clothed in his righteousness we have peace with God. We are no longer enemies of God because of our sins but are now adopted children of the most-high God, truly and deeply loved because of Christ.

Christ came to speak the truth. A truth grounded in his deep love for us: A truth that cuts to our nature but reveals his character in his death and resurrection; and a truth that carries a promise, the promise of eternal life for those who believe in Christ. Now, let us live every day in the light of that truth, in the real joy that comes from God, which is life in Christ. A life not lived in the shadows of the lies of the world but lived to glory of the one who has set us free. And may the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus our Lord. AMEN.
